



# Targeted Call for Research into Healthy Ageing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

## for funding commencing in 2019

NHMRC opened a Targeted Call for Research into Healthy Ageing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples on 20 June 2018. Applications closed on 12 September 2018.

The aim of implementing the call was to provide funding for rigorous, culturally-informed research into the health and experience of ageing in the older Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Applications received during the call were peer reviewed by an expert panel. Following peer review, six applications were funded by NHMRC. Details of the awarded grants are provided below:
