## Details of 2019 NHMRC-EU Collaborative Research Grants Recommended for Funding Commencing 2020

### About the Scheme

The NHMRC – EU Scheme provides a contribution to Australian institutions and researchers who are participating in leading international collaborative research that has been selected for funding through the European Commission Horizon 2020 Programme.

The specific objectives of the scheme are to:

- provide a financial contribution to the Australian researchers' participation in leading international research that has been favourably evaluated for funding through select Horizon 2020 topics
- support health and medical research that is of benefit to Australia.

NHMRC support was available for applicants to ten Horizon 2020 Societal Challenges topics under the Health, Demographic Change and Wellbeing work programme. The eligible topics for this round were selected based on their alignment to NHMRC's strategic priorities articulated in the NHMRC Corporate Plan.

### Funding Recommendations

The applications listed in the table below were successful through the Horizon 2020 peer review process and submitted to NHMRC for funding. NHMRC assesses applications against eligibility criteria and the requested Australian budget component of eligible applications. NHMRC does not conduct additional peer review. All six applications are eligible to receive funding from NHMRC to support the Australian component of the Horizon 2020 project. They are being recommended for funding to commence in 2020.
